Halloween Lock-in Party on October 30

There will be a Costume Contest with three different age groups for the costume categories – Category ONE: Preschool through 3rd grade; Category TWO: 4th, 5th and 6th grade; and Category THREE: 7th, 8th, and 9th grade. Prizes to be won will be for the best, scariest, funniest, most original, and prettiest costume.

Food and refreshments including pizza, vegetable trays, fruit trays, and cheese, pepperoni and cracker trays will be provided for everyone attending.
